The Campaign for Wool supports a programme devised to create appropriate welfare standards for our global sheep flocks. These are known internationally as the Five Freedoms and are devised and upheld by leading animal welfare organisations - in particular The Royal Society of Protection of Cruelty to Animals and the Chief Veterinary Officer in the UK and across the world. Many of these guidelines are very detailed, regulatory and are practise guidelines for livestock farms. These are also endorsed by The International Wool Textile Organisation (IWTO).

The Campaign's 'Freedoms of Sheep' promotion supports and reflects the spirit of those five important standards. Our aim is to imbue better understanding of the care and commitment of the global sheep farming and wool textile community in respecting the life of our sheep that year after year provide naturally grown,

THE FIVE FREEDOMS

GOOD LIFESTYLE

Freedom to express normal patterns of behaviour, sufficient space, suitable facilities and the company of its fellow sheep

GOOD NUTRITION

Freedom from hunger, thirst and malnutrition

GOOD ENVIRONMENT

Freedom from discomfort through shelter and provision of a comfortable environment

GOOD HANDLING

Freedom from fear, through good care and handling

GOOD HEALTH

Freedom from pain, injury and disease
